

Ever had that Kilkenny feeling?



Must See And Do

THE MEDIEVAL MILE

Ireland's Medieval Mile is where history meets the here and now. This is a unique discovery trail running through the heart of Kilkenny, linking St. Canice's Cathedral and a stunning Anglo-Norman castle with all sorts of medieval magic in between. There's no experience quite like it.

Stepping through the centuries, you'll see historic buildings, streets and slipways. You'll pass a Tudor Inn, a Dominican Abbey blooming with stained glass, and the only example of an early 17th century merchant's house in Ireland.

You can visit a recreated medieval garden, climb St. Canice's Round Tower (the oldest standing structure in the city), and take a glimpse inside the lives of the Butler family and their servants at Kilkenny Castle. Or feel the hairs rise and your heart beat at tales of witchcraft in Kyteler's Inn... here since 1324.

But it's not all ancient history. Kilkenny is one of Ireland's most cosmopolitan cities, with a thriving festival scene and a warm, creative and fun population. A mosey down the Medieval Mile is as much an immersion in the sights, smells and sounds of the modern city as the heritage that set it on its way.

History never felt more alive.




KILKENNY CASTLE

The Parade, Kilkenny

12th century castle remodelled in Victorian Times and set in extensive parklands. Principal seat of the Butler Family, two wings are restored to their 1830s splendour and include the magnificent Long Gallery. The Parade Tower is the Castle's Conference Centre and the River Wing houses the Butler Art Gallery.

ST. CANICE'S CATHEDRAL AND ROUND TOWER The Close, Coach Rd, Kilkenny

Visit St Canice's Cathedral, situated in Kilkenny City, to explore or take in the serenity of an early Gothic Cathedral. See the wonderful stained glass and the extensive collection of ancient monuments. A model of Kilkenny City provides a deeper understanding of the medieval city and you will also see the seat of the bishop of Ossory dating back to 1120 AD. View Kilkenny and the surrounding area from the 9th century round tower (weather permitting). Cathedral open all year round, but times change seasonally.



DUNMORE CAVE & VISITOR CENTRE

Ballyfoyle, Castlecomer Road, Kilkenny

Dunmore Cave is eleven kilometres north of Kilkenny City and, like other caves across the country, is formed by limestone which was laid down over 300 million years ago. It contains almost a quarter of a mile of passages and at its deepest point is 150 feet below the surface. A Viking massacre took place at the cave in the year 928 AD. Dunmore Cave visitor centre features an audio visual presentation and an interactive Virtual Museum. The cave is open all year round and has no wheelchair access but the visitor centre is fully accessible.

ADVENTURE ACTIVITIES

Kilkenny is chock-a-block with fun-filled outdoor adventure activities including water sports for the young and the young-at-heart.

With three of Ireland's principal rivers, the Nore, the Barrow and the Suir flowing through the region, Kilkenny really cleans up when it comes to water sport fun including whitewater kayaking, canoeing, river cruising, stand up paddle boarding and fishing.

For those of you who like to stay dry but enjoy the rush of adrenalin, Kilkenny offers excellent rock climbing, quad biking, abseiling, shooting, and an exhilarating tree top adventure walk course in Castlecomer (15 minute drive from the City). There are also a number of excellent archery and orienteering clubs where you are welcome to come along and make your mark.

Corporate groups and friends can enjoy the thrilling game of paintball or Laser Tag played at a number of specialised centres located throughout the region.

Kilkenny can be enjoyed at a leisurely pace with Pat Tynan Kilkenny Walking Tours or Kilkenny Cycling Tours.





TRAIL KILKENNY, ACTIVITY TRAILS

Trail Kilkenny has developed a range of activity and themed trails designed to inspire you to explore the County and countryside of Kilkenny. Explore the River Nore on a river walk, as it flows through the City, along the river to Bennettsbridge and as it meanders from Thomastown to Inistioge. Discover the countryside, strolling leafy lanes through woodland, uphill and across fields on one of nine scenic walks, like Brandon Hill, Kilmacoliver and O'Gorman's Lane Loops.

For the cycling enthusiast there are two long routes, one in the North and one in East Kilkenny and two shorter loops that take you through some of the County's most picturesque villages. For more information visit www.trailkilkenny.ie





ANGLING

The county's rivers afford game fishermen superb opportunities to fish for wild brown trout, salmon, and sea trout in season. Coarse anglers are well catered for with the Barrow offering first class mixed fishing for bream, dace, rudd, roach and perch.

You can enjoy equestrian activities as a refreshing aside to your holiday, or make it the main theme of a thoroughly enjoyable break. Many of Kilkenny's equestrian centres and riding schools offer residential courses where tuition, accommodation, transport and all other aspects of a great holiday are catered for.




Activities & Attractions

PARKS & GARDENS

Kilkenny offers a great variety of parks and a diverse range of historic gardens, many of which offer guided tours that give an informed insight into the plant varieties being viewed.

Kilkenny City features a reconstruction of a 17th century Irish town garden at Rothe House & Garden and a restored Georgian garden at Butler House. The Kilkenny Castle Estate is home to a charming Rose Garden and Park with 20 hectare grounds that overlook the River Nore.



Parks worth exploring in Kilkenny County include Jenkinstown, which features a Deer Park and Craft Centre, Newpark, which features a Mini Wildlife Farm, Jerpoint Park, home to The Lost Town of Newtown Jerpoint and Castlecomer Discovery Park with 80 acres of natural woodland and beautiful lakes.





GOLF

Kilkenny's location in the famed sunny South East is home to some of the finest and most enjoyable golf courses in Ireland. The mix of fine weather, proximity to Dublin and some of the finest courses in the country make Kilkenny's golf courses extremely popular with visitors. The county is dotted with luxurious golf resorts all with beautiful views of the rolling countryside.



The jewel in Kilkenny's golfing crown is the Jack Nicklaus designed Mount Juliet, one of the top inland courses in the country. Nearby is Kilkenny Golf Club, a mature parkland course that never fails to entertain. Other notable golf courses include Callan, Castlecomer, Gowran Park and Mountain View in Ballyhale. For a relaxing afternoon in a tranquil setting, Newpark Golf Driving Range offers an excellent putting green and pitching area.

From beginners to the most experienced golfer, you won't be disappointed with the lush green parkland courses available to you in Kilkenny.



SHOPPING

Kilkenny city is a fantastic shopping destination and a compact hub which features a mix of independent retailers, chic boutiques and all the leading High Street stores. It's compact, so you can stroll from one shop to another and there's plenty of on and off street parking.

The main shopping street is the city's High Street, which features boutiques, shoe shops, book shops, homeware stores, gift and craft outlets. Some of the city's best loved stores are located on High Street and the adjoining 'slips'. Even more boutiques are found along Kieran Street, which runs parallel to High Street. Kilkenny also has a wide range of excellent shopping centres.

A shopping trip to Kilkenny should definitely feature a visit to the Market Cross and MacDonagh Junction Shopping Centres.



NIGHTLIFE

Kilkenny is home to some of Ireland's most vibrant and unique pubs. Enjoy live music in traditional pubs, soak up the historic atmosphere at medieval establishments and dance the night away at one of Kilkenny's late night bars or clubs.

DESIGN & CRAFT

Kilkenny is renowned as the 'Craft Capital of Ireland', so you have come to the right place whether you are interested in pottery, leather goods, knitwear, custom made furniture, handmade jewellery, glass or candles. The Kilkenny Design Centre and Kilkenny's Castle Yard are located opposite Kilkenny Castle and are well worth a visit for design and craft lovers. Browse the best of Irish and locally made produce in the Kilkenny Design Centre and check out exciting exhibitions in the National Craft Gallery, located in the Castle Yard.

Kilkenny's Castle Yard, built in the 1780s by the Butlers, Earls of Ormonde, was also home to the Kilkenny Design Workshops (KDW) from 1965 - 1988. Tap in to Kilkenny's rich design history and download the Kilkenny Design Workshops free iPad App.

MADE IN KILKENNY CRAFT TRAIL

Discover authentic craft being created by designer makers all over the County with the MADE in Kilkenny Craft Trail. Using the most modern techniques as well as preserving and developing age old methods, the members of MADE create unique pieces. From the white-hot furnace of the glass blower, the throwing wheel of the potter to the practiced hammering of precious metals by fine jewellers, careful carving and etching of stone and the manipulation of willow, you'll find that many of the crafts people open their studios and some are available to visit by appointment.

LOCAL PRODUCE

Generations of farming, food production and food heritage can be felt in every corner of Kilkenny City and County. Kilkenny has a number of cookery schools, with a range of beginners and advanced courses, that work with local produce. If you are in Kilkenny on a Thursday morning, check out the busy farmers market on the Parade in the City centre, where you can buy the best of local produce from Kilkenny farmers' and food producers.



Kilkenny's thriving food and drink culture can be enjoyed in a diverse range of cafés and restaurants across the City and County. A walk through Kilkenny City will bring you on a winding path of charming cafés and superb restaurants. Kilkenny County is dotted with eateries where you can enjoy local produce in picturesque settings. From casual to Michelin star dining, Kilkenny has exceptional food experiences for all taste buds and budgets.


Activities & Attractions

THE RIVER VALLEY ROUTE

The necklace of towns and villages threaded along the River Nore is one of the South East's most beguiling hidden gems. Road and river intertwine as you pass from one to the next, coming within kissing distance before shying away again. It's truly a timeless drive. There's no end of potential stopoffs on this route – ranging from river views to heritage husks like Jerpoint Abbey, or the bustling shops and cafés tucked away in the towns themselves.

Discover a deserted medieval town at Jerpoint Park, where you can also enjoy a horse and cart ride, sheepdog demonstrations, a nature walk, or an elegant afternoon tea in the tearooms. Or why not dip into the Made in Kilkenny Craft Trail, sampling handmade candles in BENNETTSBRIDGE, the flour mill that serves as Nicholas Mosse's pottery studio, or vibrant ceramics in THOMASTOWN?

Continuing south through the NORE VALLEY (via R700), watch out for wading anglers, or take a photo stop at a lay-by overlooking the Anglo-Norman Grennan Castle. At INISTIOGE, don't miss Woodstock Gardens, home to the longest monkey-puzzle avenue in Europe, or the handsome 10-arched bridge. Unusually too, Catholic and Protestant churches stand side by side in this village.







After NEW ROSS (via R729), this route swaps the River Nore for the River Barrow, veering north through ST. MULLIN'S, GRAIGUENAMANAGH and BORRIS, before returning to KILKENNY. The River Barrow was a motorway before motorways existed, as the heritage jewels along its banks testify - from old mills to monastic sites, from grand treasures like Duiske Abbey to the old towpaths now serving as riverside walks. At St. Mullin's, scramble up the old Norman motte for a smashing panorama over the gorge and gravestones below.

Further north, don't let the apparent modesty of BORRIS fool you. Borris House was not only ancestral home of the Kings of Leinster, but to the redoubtable Arthur Kavanagh. Born in 1831, Kavanagh was an MP, Lord Lieutenant of Carlow, an expert sailor, prolific ladies' man, superb horse rider and an adventurer whose travels took him as far as the Persian






